

Covid-19 catch-up premium plans (2020-2021)

Schools receive their COVID-19 catch-up premium based on the number of students on roll. This funding must be used for specific activities to support students to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months, in line with the guidance on <u>coronavirus catch-up premium</u>.

Schools have the flexibility to spend their funding in the best way for their cohort and circumstances. To support schools to make the best use of this funding, the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) published a <u>coronavirus (COVID-19)</u> <u>support guide for schools</u> with evidence-based approaches to catch up for all students. Where appropriate, we have used this document to help direct our additional funding in the most effective way.
