Pearson Functional Skills English (Entry Level)	Functional skills English is a course that has been selected as it concentrates on skills that are essential for our everyday lives. Giving a good basis for work and independent living skills. Functional skills English focuses on three key areas: Reading, Writing and Speaking & Listening. These key communication skills focus on next steps for our learners.
Pearson Functional Skills Maths (Entry Level)	Functional skills Maths is a course that has been selected as it concentrates on skills that are essential for our everyday lives. Giving a good basis for work and independent living skills. These qualifications build up to give a good basis for learners for life after Iffley. Functional skills maths envelopes all the key Math skills that we would need for budgeting, small home projects, work based problems and a whole host of skills that we consider important on a daily basis.
Art Award Discover	The Art Award encourages learners to participate, share and research different art styles. This broadens students' experiences allowing them to develop ideas in a creative manner. We work with local artists and the city museums to develop this course which is engaging and peaks our learners imagination. Through the award they develop their own art skills as well as considering different cultures, art styles and engage in wider conversations.

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Entry Level ASDAN PSD	The PSD qualification is focused on developing our learners into physically, emotionally and socially healthy individuals. The course encourages them to become positive responsible citizens. The course also teaches our learners how to manage risk within their own lives and develop their independence skills.
Entry Level WJEC Humanities	This course is accessible to our learners and develops a broad experience with different areas of humanities studies. There is a breadth of choice within the course which allows us to deliver an engaging and relevant curriculum, which appropriately exposes our learners to considerations of the wider world.
Arts Award Explore	The Explore Award is an Entry level 3 award that allows our learners experience with different artistic mediums. It gives them the experience of creating, apprecitaing and evaluating their art experience. Learners take part in different art activities and explore art with an artist. We partner with Oxfordshire museums to deliver experience of an art organisation and engage in activities we would not usually be able to facilitate as a school alone.
Entry Level Science	This Pearson course is developed to engage learners and increase their confidence and engagement with Science. Assessment is classroom based with class teachers overseeing their formal assessments. Units are chosen by staff that fit the cohort and develop understanding of the world around us.
Pearson Functional Skills ICT Entry Level and Level 1/2	Pearson delivers an ICT course that focuses on key skills for work and home life. The development of skills required such as email usage, basic spreadsheets and word processing are included in this course.
Pearson Functional Skills Maths Entry Level and Level 1/2	Pearson provides us with a diverse Maths course that begins at Entry level 1 for basic maths skills and progresses to Level 2 which would include skills for the workplace. Students follow this progression at their own pace with support from their class teachers to develop the skills required for increased independence.
Pearson Functional Skills English Entry Level and Level 1/2	Our English functional skills course is provided by Pearson and they focus on three core areas of English. Reading, Writing and Speaking & Listening. Our learners develop these skills from Entry level 1 to Level 2 at a pace that is suitable for them. The skills provided through this course allows for developing independence and giving a stepping stone for personal and working life in the future.
BTEC Home-cooking Level 1	The BTEC Home-cooking course has a focus on home meal preparation and developing learners' independence where it comes to planning and preparing nutritious meals. There are elements that focus on budgeting and ensuring that meals meet nutrition needs for the individuals they are being prepared for. Learners have a range of different cooking methods and styles that they will experience such as baking and soup making. This will lead to a portfolio of evidence in order to gain their award.
ASDAN Short courses	Where a need is identified there are options to allow learners to complete short courses through ASDAN to get them used to assessment processes. These courses are specific and short term and allow a focus on particular skills in order for students to increase their independence and practise good learning behaviours.
NOCN Construction Entry Level 3	This is a practical course that allows students to have an introduction into construction activities that would be experienced in the world of work. The award focuses on basic skills and health & safety considerations.
Entry Level WJEC Health and Fitness	This Entry Pathways Healthy Living and Fitness qualification provides learners with the opportunity to participate in a variety of sporting and health and fitness activities. Learners will develop an understanding of factors which contribute to their own and others healthy living and fitness.

Art Award Bronze	This level 1 course follows on from previous art awards in the lower school galleries. It allows for further exploration of artistic methods and the development of artistic skill. The encouragement of creativity and the opportunity to explore artists in more depth is an excellent experience for our learners. It helps develop confidence, curiosity and communication skills.
Pearson BTEC Vocational Studies Level 1	This diploma is a flexible far reaching qualification which allows a dynamic breadth of study and develops students independence and work skills. The course allows a variety of choices for our class teachers to engage learners with and focuses on skills required for entering the workplace. Subjects that can be chosen include Sports, Media, Hospitality, Public services and many more.
Pearson Functional Skills ICT Entry Level and Level 1/2	Pearson delivers an ICT course that focuses on key skills for work and home life. The development of skills required such as email usage, basic spreadsheets and word processing are included in this course.
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NOCN Independent skills Entry Level	NOCN independence skills provides a basis for learners to consider the different skills that they would need when they move on to living in a more independent manner. Units within this award vary from Getting around safely to household cleaning and basic cooking skills. This award is available from Entry 1 to Entry 3.
NOCN Rights and Responsibilities Entry Level	Within the independence skills suite of qualifications we deliver a course surrounding the rights and responsibilities of our learners. This allows for exploration of choice and what we as good citizens would do in different situations. This also defines areas such as choice an individual has which helps to safeguard our more vulnerable learners.
NOCN Accessing community facilities Entry Level	Within the independence skills we also consider the access of our local community and the award related to this allows our learners the experience of using different community facilities such as a library or gym, but also develops the knowledge of where to access help in times of need.
NOCN Employability Skills Entry Level	Employability skills is another entry level qualification that is delivered within the NOCN suite of qualifications. This award allows students to practise and develop skills required for the workplace. This can be specific skills in say the retail industry but can also be broader skills such as how to deal with a disagreement in the workplace. This qualification aims to prepare learners for their working life.
Duke of Edinburgh Award BRONZE	The Duke of Edinburgh award helps young people build life-long belief in themselves, supporting them to take on their own challenges, follow their passions, and discover talents they never knew they had. This award suits our students as it can be tailored to needs and interests and so really gives our students a valuable relatable experience, encouraging independence, communication and a growth mindset. The course provides a springboard into adult life experiences.
