

## Introduction

The Department for Education (DfE) has stated that the PE and sport premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2020 to 2021 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

## Bardwell School's PE and Sports Grant for 2020/21 is £16,410.

This report outlines our use of the PE and Sports Premium in previous years and the impact this has had on our pupils. It then goes on to detail plans for spending the 2020/21 premium and how we will measure the impact of this expenditure. At the end of the year we will reflect on progress against the expenditure and detail our plan for ensuring the measures are sustainable.

## PE and Sports Grant 2020/21 – Impact report

In 2020/21 Bardwell School received a PE and sport premium allocation of £16,450.

Additional allocation of staffing to Hydrotherapy Pool	Due to the changing and increasing specific physical needs of our primary pupils we are providing an additional 3 days support staff in the hydrotherapy pool.	Due to Covid restriction the Hydrotherapy Pool was closed for significant parts of 2020/21. Whilst this role supported hydrotherapy and swimming when possible, it also supported wider curriculum support. Development of a swimming curriculum and assessment system	Prior to 2020/21, the school's approach to learning water confidence and techniques was not underpinned by a bespoke curriculum that met the needs of our population. By linking an experienced teacher with the Pool Manager and Pool Assistant the focus of this initiative was develop the curriculum and establish assessment in line with the wider curriculum.	The development of the curriculum and assessment system was shared with all staff during a whole school Inset. This meant that the approaches and principles were understood by all staff who support in the pool.  There is clearly a structure to setting targets, assessing and reporting for swimming that is now inline with the rest of the curriculum. This has led to more focus activities, which have also been enhanced by adding a 'whole lesson' principle to the swimming sessions rather than just a skills focus. The lead researched, set up and facilitated whole school Inset for staff involving Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists and staff leading workshops. This raised the profile and engagement from all staff. Systems have been introduced (and will benefit from further embedding) which include movement plans being on the daily timetable and lessons plan detailing how positioning is embedded across the curriculum alongside other learning.
