1-Home Cooking (BTEC) - Spec 2-Pre-Vocational Studies Accreditation (BTEC) [focusing on digital media and enterprise] - Spec 3-Arts Award-Explore - Spec 4- Introduction to Construction (NOCN) - Spec 5- Introduction to Land Based Studies (BTEC Level 1)- Spec	Options: Students have a meeting at the end of Year 10 in which their interests are explored. This is matched with career aspirations. From this information, students complete and accreditation option. NOCN Employability Skills - Spec	Employability Skills provides and encourages practical opportunities to build on learning from Guggenheim Gallery and for students to learn a range of core skills needed to support employability. These are then built on and demonstrated through work experience opportunities.
NOCN Independent Living - NOCN Living in the Community - Looking After Yourself and Your Home Spec	Living in the Community the program is designed to develop skills needed to operate with a community, particularly access and using services. This builds on previous learning and allows for more in depth focus within key areas. Looking After Yourself and Your Home develops essential life skills, including personal care, household management, budgeting, health, safety, and maintaining a clean, organised living environment.
