Meningitis B

We would like to make you aware that there have been some reported cases of Meningitis B within Oxfordshire. While there is no cause for alarm, we feel it is important to share information so that families are aware of the signs and symptoms and know when to seek medical advice.

Meningitis B is a bacterial infection that can become serious quickly. Early symptoms can often resemble common viral illnesses such as flu. As a school we have attended an information briefing and it has been made clear that there is no additional risk for people who have compromised immune systems. Also that students in Year 8 and above will not have had a Meningitis B vaccine, as this has only been available since 2015.
