

Introduction

The Department for Education (DfE) has stated that the PE and sport premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2022 to 2023 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

This report documents the expenditure and impact of the PE and Sports Grant in 2021/22, before going on to details plans for the Grant in 2022/23.

Bardwell School's PE and Sports Grant for 2021/22 - Impact Report

In 2021/22 Bardwell School received £16,410 PE and Sports Grant. The table below outlines the initiatives this was spent on and the impact on pupils.
